BEAVERTON AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE ENDORSES ONE IN CUMBENT AND TWO NEW CANDIDATES IN LOCAL LEGISLATIVE RACES

The Candidate Endorsement Council of the Beaverton Area Chamber of Commerce turned to two new candidates and one incumbent in three of the six state legislative races that impact the eastern parts of Washington County.

"The Council and many of my fellow Chamber members continue to be concerned about the far-reaching effects of Measures 66 and 67, especially now that we see this taxation of Oregon businesses may only yield half of what was originally predicted," said Lorraine Clarno, President/ CEO of the Beaverton Area Chamber of Commerce.

The Council endorsed the non-incumbent in two state House races. In House District 27, the Council chose newcomer Republican Dan Lucas over incumbent Democrat Tobias Read, citing Lucas's support of tax reform, and his endeavor to make Oregon employer-friendly again by working to reduce taxes, fees and crippling regulations on businesses.

In House District 28, the Council gave its support to Republican Bill Berg, over Democrat incumbent Jeff Barker. In its endorsement, Berg's specific points of job creation, private-sector growth, fiscal responsibility and accountability were cited.

Running to again represent District 17 in the Oregon Senate, incumbent Democrat Suzanne Bonamici again received the Council's endorsement, with her issue platform of re-enacting Access to Business Capital Act and streamlining the process for small and emerging businesses to obtain loans through the Business Oregon loan funds. The Council also noted she supports Business Energy Tax Credits and incentives such as the Strategic Investment Program.

"The Council and the larger membership of the Chamber believe a longer term approach of tax and finance reform is crucial," said the Council's chair, Scott Burgess, the president and CEO of Rivermark Community Credit Union. "We chose this year to recognize candidates who are dedicated to business development and growth for Beaverton, and for Oregon."

Keep the County Safe & Provide Access to Information!

Beaverton and Washington County will have the opportunity to renew two vital levies in November.

1) **Public Safety Services Levy:** A renewed levy would provide funds for personnel and services for 5 years. This includes:

-Operation of the county jail and minimizing early release of offenders; -Providing for enforcement teams, prosecutors, probation and parole officers in the investigation of crimes and prosecution of criminals; -Monitoring sex offenders

-Supporting emergency shelters for victims of domestic violence (the only shelter in all of Washington County), and the homeless.

Washington County strives to provide for our citizens in crisis and in need. These vital services are critical to our safety, quality of life and local economy. We encourage your YES vote on the Public Safety Services Renewal Levy. Rate remains unchanged at .42cents/ per \$1,000 of assessed value.

2) **Countywide Library Services:** For 34 years, the Washington County Library co-op has provided funding for public library operations, centralized branch support and outreach programs linking residents to their community libraries. In the past 2 years, check-out rates have increased 32% and branch visits have increased 23%. During periods of economic downturn, demands for access to information increase.

The Beaverton Area Chamber of Commerce believes strongly that providing our citizens with information is vital to preserving and growing our community. The current co-op system is cost effective and provides accessibility to vital information. We urge you to vote YES on the Washington County Library Renewal Levy. Rate remains unchanged at .17cents/ \$1,000 of assessed value.

Community News...

Beaverton N amed a 2010 "Smarter City" Energy Leader

- Energy efficiency projects, solar power program and renewable energy purchases among factors; Beaverton one of only four small cities in the U.S. named to list -

Beaverton is one of just 22 cities across the U.S., and one of just four with populations under 100,000, named to the Natural Resources Defense Fund's (NRDC) "Smarter City" list of energy leaders. "We have a supportive and creative administration," said Cindy Tatham, Sustainability Program Coordinator. "We are not afraid to be leaders. If we can demonstrate a sustainability benefit to the community, there is a lot of support on projects."

Projects that propelled Beaverton to the top included several initiatives identified in Mayor Denny Doyle's 10 Point Plan such as making city buildings more energy efficient, offering weatherization loans to residents and a greenhouse gas emissions inventory. In addition, Beaverton has changed traffic signals over to Light-Emitting Diode (LED) technology and, with federal stimulus money, is updating streetlights. Solar Beaverton, a residential pilot solar energy program launched in May, helped raise Beaverton's profile as well, significantly reducing the upfront costs of installing solar power in homes using federal and state tax credits, energy incentives and bulk pricing. Other areas of responsible energy use included Beaverton's highly energy-efficient central plant, community participation in Environmental Protection Agency's Green Power programs as well as a reduction in carbon footprint between 2000 and 2005.

The selection process began with a list of 655 cities with populations greater than 50,000. The list was whittled down to 22 by comparing carbon dioxide emission reductions, home heating and electricity consumption as well as considering factors such as designation as an EPA Green Power Community.
